LO1 – fully met. I found the chambers training day helpful and feel far more confident in my ability to handle vulnerable clients and others appropriately. I discussed the training day with my mentor, who gave me good feedback on my notes from the discussion. I have also received positive feedback from a vulnerable client that I handled their case sensitively.

LO2 – fully met. I found it helpful to follow up on what I learned during the unconscious bias training I attended with podcasts and reading materials recommended by the trainer, as well as those I found from my research. I want to learn more in this area so I can be more proactive in my approach to being anti-racist in my work. In the future, I would like to be more involved in the E&D work in chambers.

LO3 – fully met. I feel fully confident in my knowledge of my responsibilities under GDPR and have learned enough to help draft training materials for colleagues in chambers. My colleague who delivered the GDPR training gave me good feedback on the quality of the information I provided.

LO4 – partially met. I kept abreast of changes in the law, but I think this is an ongoing objective for me as things keep changing. For example, I want to keep informed about the new Criminal Justice Bill.
