The application to become an AETO is now available via <u>MyBar</u> to applicants wishing to apply for authorisation.

Before you apply, we suggest that you view the <u>Authorisation Framework</u> document and have regard to the <u>Bar Qualification Manual</u> and <u>Professional Statement</u> for barristers.

## Application process

You will need to nominate a principal point of contact ('PPC') for the application. The PPC will need to log in to their <u>own</u> account on MyBar.
