I would have liked to do more work on LO1 to understand and appreciate the differences between commercial law and practice in England and Wales and other international jurisdictions. I believe there appears to be a lack of lectures offered by ChBA/COMBAR on this topic. I intend to carry forward this learning objective and to meet it in 2024 by looking at the following publications in particular: - Bickley, Bermuda, BVI and Cayman Islands company law, 2013; and - Ho, Cross-border insolvency: a commentary on the UNCITRAL model law, 2017.

I would also like to participate in a cross-examination and/or expert witness workshop offered by COMBAR/ChBA. I will keep a particular eye out for this to further enhance my work on LO2.

I found the COMBAR and Chancery Bar Association lectures useful. For example, the seminar on the construction of contracts provided an understanding of current trends in the interpretation of contracts. This has enabled me to better advise clients on the interpretation of contracts and possible approaches of the Court. In the October lecture on Attribution and Agency, the lecturer made a (what I found to be) very useful distinction between direct claims and parasitic claims. In my opinion, that is a very clarifying way of thinking about the different claims and what is required.
