Part 4: BPTC graduate progression statistics

Part 4: BPTC graduate progression statistics: both aggregated and by provider (full-time and part-time BPTC students)

The charts in Part 4 are based on first six pupillages commencing between 1 October 2013 and 31 March 2019 inclusive. Graduates in the cohorts covered by this report who have secured pupillage since 31 March 2019 will be included in the next publication.

Students may start pupillage up to five years after successfully completing the BPTC. These charts do not include pupils who either passed the BPTC prior to 2014 or who took another route to qualifying as a barrister in England and Wales, for example by virtue of having passed the Bar Transfer Test.

Not all students taking the BPTC will wish to undertake pupillage, or wish to remain to practise in the UK. There are relatively few overseas domiciled BPTC graduates that have gained pupillage in the UK following completion of the course, and for this reason, the majority of the charts in Part 4 contain data on UK/EU domiciled BPTC graduates only. Of the BPTC graduates enrolling in the academic years commencing 2013-2017, 35 BPTC graduates who were domiciled overseas prior to enrolling on the course gained first six pupillage in comparison to 1339 UK/EU domiciled BPTC graduates.




4. A. 1. Domicile of full-time and part-time BPTC graduates commencing first six pupillage

Number of graduates gaining pupillage Percentage of graduates of each domicile gaining pupillage








4. A. 4. Pupillage rate of BPTC graduates, by part-time and full-time mode of study: UK/EU domiciled students






BPTC start year and overall BPTC grade








BPTC grade, first degree classification, and ethnic group




First degree classification, BPTC grade and gender




First degree classification, BPTC grade and gender









4. B. 2. Pupillage rate of BPTC graduates, by provider: UK/EU domiciled students






4. B. 4. Percentage of graduates with each BPTC grade commencing first six pupillage, by provider: UK/EU domiciled students – 2013-2017 aggregated
